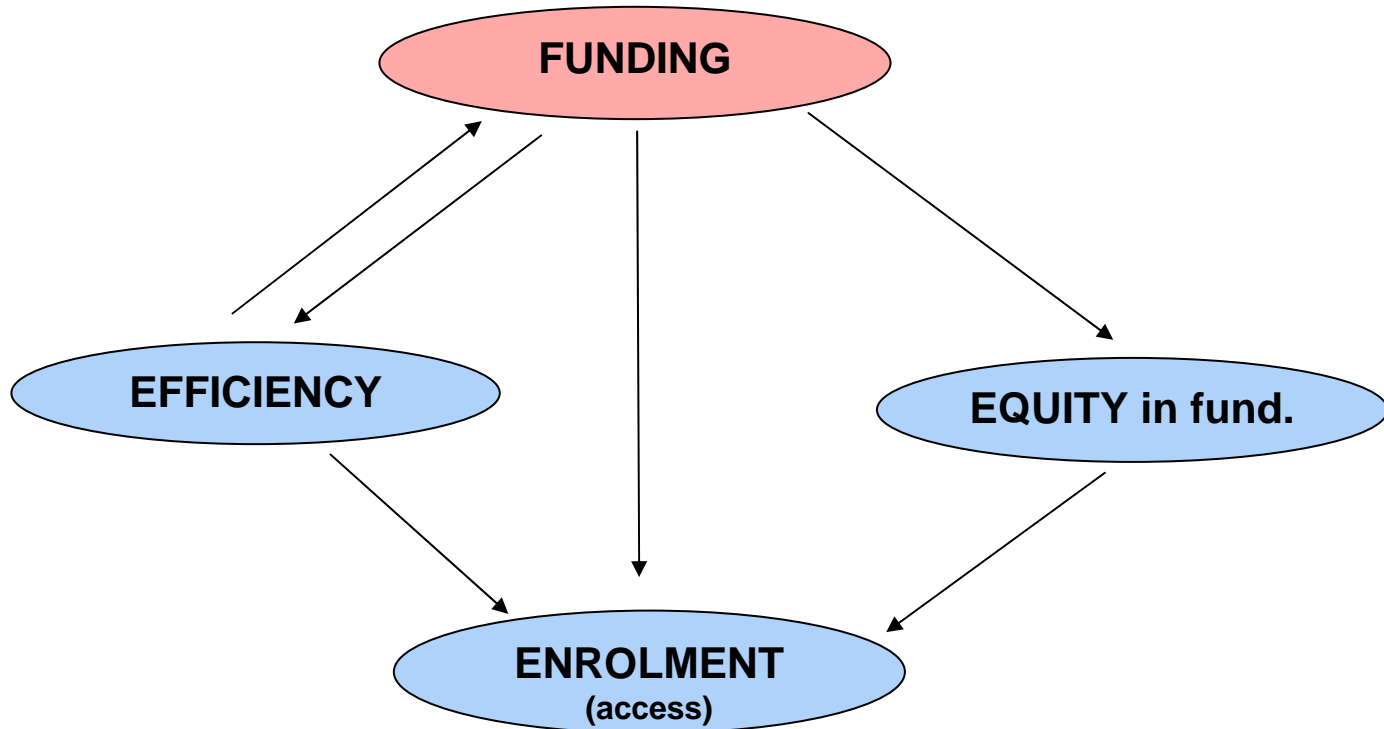

RELATIONS BETWEEN FUNDING, EQUITY AND EFFICIENCY OF HE - limitations for their measurement
